BIOS

Diana Brown is a multiracial, bi-sexual, performing and teaching artist, producer, director and playwright. Diana is half of the nationally touring improv comedy duo Bingewatch. Diana leads all levels of improv classes at Berkeley Repertory Theatre's School of Theatre. She's Director of Community, Senior Producer, and on faculty with Leela Improv Theatre Company and Training Center, San Francisco. Diana directs the improv ensembles The Professionals, and Foolhardy.



StormMiguel Florez is a trans, queer Chicane filmmaker, whose work as a multi-hyphenate filmmaker includes the award-winning films, The Whistle (dir. StormMiguel Florez), MAJOR! (dir. Annalise Ophelian, and Vulveeta (dir. Maria Breaux). StormMiguel is currently working on his feature narrative directorial debut, Welcome To Roswell, which has been supported by San Francisco Arts Commission, SFFILM/Rainin, Sundance, Peacock Rebellion/Queer Arts Exchange, Film Fatales, and Stowe Story Labs. StormMiguel is also an event producer, actor, and a life-long musician. His first acting role was at the tender age of ten in the made for TV movie, Police Woman Centerfold. He's originally from Albuquerque, NM and has lived in the San Francisco Bay Area for over 25 years.



Maria Breaux is a San Francisco filmmaker and owner/operator of MBreauxsia Films. Her mockumentary Vulveeta, which she directed, wrote, and acts in, won the Framline Audience Award in 2022. She was a contributing cinematographer on 99%—The Occupy Wall Street Collaborative Film, which premiered at Sundance Film Festival and is distributed by Participant Media. Her short film set during the 1980s Salvadoran Civil War, Lucha, won the Frameline33 Audience Award for Best Short, was nominated for an Iris Prize, and is distributed by Peccadillo Pictures. Her feature Mother Country premiered at the American Black Film Festival and won a Silver Remi at WorldFest Houston. Before making movies, Maria was a solo and sketch comedy performer in San Francisco during the 1990s.





Mattee currently works as a Supervisor for HIV Prevention Programs for First Nations Community HealthSource in Albuquerque, NM. Mattee is also a Board Member for the Transgender Resource Center of New Mexico, and A member of the Southwest Indigenous Women's Coalition Native LGBTQ. Mattee has been Blessed to have many years of Sobriety and also takes honor in being a Mentor, Advocate, role model, Trainer, Consultant, Leader, and a Strong Native Transgender Woman. Welcome to Roswell is her acting debut.



Edna Mira Raia is an award winning comedic writer and performer. She is a graduate of Second City Chicago's improv conservatory program, which built onto her clown and mime training from the late Flying Actor Studio. Edna is a producer, director, teaching artist and sound designer. Find her performing with the drag troupe, Palace of Trash, her drag family, House of Ross and in her YouTube series, "Tater Sprouts."



Marcia Aguilar Kailian Marcia Aguilar Kailian, MA, RDT (she/they), is a registered drama therapist and actress based in San Francisco. With a focus on authenticity and inclusivity, Marcia brings a queer perspective to their work. Fluent in both English and Spanish, Marcia combines play, theater, and healing in their bilingual drama therapy practice. They offer improvisational theater workshops in San Francisco and Berkeley, emphasizing the importance of spontaneity, active listening, teamwork, and emotional expression for effective personal communication and anxiety reduction. They are currently performing with improv troupe Lucky Dog Theatre. As a recipient of a SF Arts Commission grant, she's created her own solo shows: Family Photo, Make Marcia Great Again, and La Mamá Chingona (currently being developed into a full length play).
